Agitated	You are a 39 year old bipolar woman with a daughter who is currently in
Patient	your husband's custody. Your daughter was recently hospitalized for
	pneumonia and discharged a day or two later - she is currently in Thunder
	Bay visiting her grandma. You arrive at the hospital under the delusion
	that your daughter is still at the hospital and that the hospital is lying to
	you about where she is. You become increasingly agitated and violent as
	the scenario rolls on.
	Stage 1
	 You confront the nurses at the nurse's desk, demanding to see
	your daughter. You are angry and convinced that the nurse is
	lying to you when she says that your daughter is not here
	Example phrases:
	"Take me to my daughter! I know she's here!"
	"I know he's telling you to hide her from me"
	■ "You're lying!"
	"Stop looking at me like I'm fucking crazy!"
	They will attempt to verablly de-escalate the situation with you,
	but you are having none of it. You grow increasingly frustrated
	and angry.
	Stage 2 - Physician enters
	When the physician enters, you get much more agitated. You pull
	out your kitchen knife and threaten both the physician and nurse
	If the physician and nurse don't immediately leave the scene
	within 90 seconds, you attempt to take the nurse hostage to
	force the hospital to bring your daughter to you
	Stage 3 - Police Arrive
	Everyone has left, leaving you alone in the ER. You're still agitated
	and yelling for them to bring your daughter
	The police come, and eventually they convince you to drop your
	weapon
	When they attempt to sedate you, if they don't give you a
	ketamine injection (so if they administer haloperidol or Ativan)
	then it doesn't work and you remain aggressive
	Stage 4 - You take the Nurse Hostage
	You grab hold of the nurse and threaten to cut her with your
	knife.
	 This one will take some artistic license from you, as how this
	situation resolves will likely be very different in different settings.
