

Case Briefing

Jenna Bryan, a 33-year-old female (G3T1P1A1L2) presents to the ED with her husband following a spontaneous vaginal delivery approximately 45 minutes ago at their family home. The baby was born at 36 weeks gestation, appears healthy and is being examined by an ED RN.

The husband, seemingly distraught, informs you that Jenna continues to bleed. He informs you that their previous birth was in hospital and there were no complications, so they opted to deliver this baby at home. They had been receiving regular prenatal care. Her most recent prenatal visit was two weeks ago, with her next one being scheduled for tomorrow. The husband then leaves to check on their newborn.

You are the physician on call for labour and delivery at a rural 1A maternity site and there is one RN available to assist you. The nearest urban centre is 300km away.
